



## Child Find

### For Children with Disabilities Birth through Age 21 in Shrewsbury Borough

#### What is Child Find?

Child Find is an ongoing process to identify children between birth through age 21 who may have disabilities and would be eligible for early intervention services or special education and related services.

#### Infants and Toddlers

The NJ Early Intervention Systems (NJEIS) provides services for infants and toddlers, age birth to three years of age, with developmental delays and disabilities, and their families.

#### Preschool Children and Students

If you are concerned your preschool child or student is developing differently, you can call the Shrewsbury Borough School Special Education Department at 732-747-0882 ext. 115.

#### Who may make a referral for services?

Parents may request an evaluation to determine their child's eligibility for services. However, physicians, nurses, psychologist, social workers and other may make a referral after discussing it with parent.

#### What kinds of services are available for children from birth through age 3?

Early intervention Services are provided to children:

- Within the family routine;
- Within their natural environments (home and community);
- In setting which children without disabilities participate;
- and with active participation of families

#### What kinds of services are available for children with disabilities age 3-21?

A free, appropriate public education (FAPE) may include services such as supplementary aids and services or specialized instruction within the general education class or through a resource program or special class in or out the district.

#### Are students in private schools eligible for public education services as well as students in public schools?

Yes. Parents may request an evaluation to determine eligibility of their child through their private school. If eligible, special education and related services may be requested as well. Services may be provided up to the extent that state and federal funding permit. The resident district is responsible, although the services may be provided through the district in which the school is located or by another public agency.

#### How are these services determined?

An individualized service program (IFSP) for infants and toddlers is developed by the parents and early intervention professionals.

An individualized education (IEP) is developed for students with disabilities age 3-21 by the parent, child study team members and teacher. The IEP includes goals and objectives and describes the nature of the program and services to be provided.
